With over 7000 students catered for among our CCM schools, Seaview Christian College enjoys the support, expertise and experience available across our member schools and Central Office based at the Groves campus in Queensland.

Seaview Christian College opened in February 2016 and has now grown into an accredited R–12 co-educational day school. We offer a strong and holistic secondary program that supports academic excellence, faith development, and student wellbeing. With Year 7 students confidently integrated into high school, the College provides a seamless transition from primary through to senior secondary education

The passionate staff, happy students, excellent facilities, and supportive wider community all contribute to the "Seaview Effect" – the something special you feel and experience upon entering the school grounds or when you become part of the college community.

COLLEGE COMMUNITY

The College's welcoming atmosphere is tangible the moment you enter the college grounds. Visitors to the school often comment on the happy and respectful nature of the students and staff alike.

Volunteers add much value to the upkeep of the facilities, and in helping in learning support and library-related administration. The College aims to bring families together for Family Fun evenings three – four times a year.

Seaview has regular visits from a range of health care professionals to support each child holistically. Our psychologist visits monthly whereas speech and occupational therapists visit fortnightly. Seaview is committed to creating multi-disciplinary teams to support students' development.

Almost half of our students identify as Aboriginal, with the majority of the student cohort born in Australia. The Seaview community strives to be inclusive and respectful of all our students' heritage and we value the enriching conversations and experiences that result from a multi-cultural school cohort. The supportive parent body shares the responsibility of educating children. Healthy and productive communication between the College and home is encouraged and valued to enhance the education process.

The College strives to keep college fees as affordable as possible. Where financial constraints are identified in parents' ability to pay the full fees, concessions are offered. We therefore encourage families from all walks of life to enquire about enrolment at the College. As an inclusive school community, we will make sure that limited ability to pay school fees never becomes a barrier to receiving a quality education. We seek to accommodate families who desire an education where the Australian curriculum is delivered from a Christian worldview as opposed to a secular worldview.

SOCIAL CLIMATE

Seaview Christian College provides an educational environment where students, staff and parents feel safe and valued. Respectful interaction with one another is a well-established characteristic of the college community. Respect for one another, for others and for college property is the norm.

Seaview adopts a mindset of zero tolerance for bullying. Effective behaviour management, including positive reinforcement and restorative practices ensure safe and happy learning environments, where students are valued and celebrated as individuals. The college has a continued focus on "The Zones of Regulation". This program supports R-12 students self-regulate and manage daily emotions. Teachers aim to keep parents well-informed as the College partners with parents to ensure that certain expectations around schooling are reinforced at home.

The College's Annual Awards Night offers the ideal platform to celebrate student achievements for the academic year. Students' diligence and positive character traits are also acknowledged. Faithful service from the Seaview's volunteers as well as student leadership is also celebrated on this special evening.

The College upholds comprehensive Child Protection and Anti-Bullying Policies, contributing to an environment where students feel safe and valued. The college chaplain offers valuable additional social and emotional support for students when required.

COMMUNITY SATISFACTION WITH THE COLLEGE

Every year a parent satisfaction survey is conducted at Seaview Christian College. The survey provides valuable feedback to consider possible areas of improvement, as the College is committed to continuous improvement. The 2024 parent survey resulted in a 91% completion rate. The feedback was well received with most responses indicating appreciation of the College staff, operations and facilities. Key indicator responses include:

- > 100% of respondents felt that they were likely to recommend the College to others.
- > 100% of respondents indicated that they are satisfied with the Christian ethos.
- ➤ 100% of respondents were satisfied with the level of care for the students.
- ➤ 100% of respondents were satisfied with the community atmosphere.
- ➤ 100% of respondents were satisfied with the quality of teachers.
- 100% of respondents were satisfied with the teaching and learning taking place at the College.
- > 99% of respondents indicated that they considered enrolling students at the College good value for money.

COLLEGE CURRICULUM

Students at Seaview Christian College take part in educational programs that are aligned with the Australian Curriculum. Students requiring intervention are catered for by the teaching and teacher support staff who use in-class and withdrawal support strategies aligned with intervention programs. Data from external and internal diagnostic testing in Literacy and Numeracy is used to identify at-risk students, i.e. both gifted and talented and those with learning needs. This data is also used to inform curriculum program revision.

Differentiation in learning programs caters for students who are considered gifted through to students who are experiencing learning difficulties. Intervention programs such as MacqLit, focused on Literacy progression, are provided to fill learning gaps for students in Years 3-10. Support to students provide by an Inclusive Education Teacher which operates either 1:1, within small groups or in class support. Teaching and support staff engage in a range of professional development sessions throughout the year to ensure that teaching practices remain at the forefront of new developments. Pastoral care for students is an essential part of catering for the overall wellbeing of students. The school Chaplain is available for students, staff and parents. We consider every staff member to be a Student Welfare Officer and students know that they can approach any staff member for support and guidance when facing challenging circumstances.

HOW NON-ATTENDANCE IS MANAGED BY THE COLLEGE

Parents are required to notify the college office either by phone, text message, College app or email by 8:30am on the day of absence. If absence is unexplained by 8:45am, the college office contacts parents via text then if needed by phone to confirm a reason for absence. If the absence is still unexplained, classroom teachers follow up every Friday via phone contact and/or email then a formal letter from the College seeking an explanation.

Student absences are discussed with parents during parent-teacher interviews twice a year. Regular non-attendance follows site policies to increase support from the College to minimise.

Families who require extended leave for appropriate reasons are required to complete and submit an attendance exemption form for approval by the Principal.

NAPLAN RESULTS

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is conducted annually for students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. We encourage students to participate in these assessments.

The data we receive from participating students enables us to track individual progress and how particular groups of students are growing academically. This informs our teaching and learning practices alongside our other data collection tools.

YEAR 12 OUTCOMES

2024 saw the first cohort of Year 12 students complete their schooling at SCC. There are 2 main results for Year 12 students in SA and at SCC:

- An achievement (or not) of their SACE certificate and (if applicable)
- · An ATAR that enables entry into university.

While some students will have received both their SACE and an ATAR, others may have only received their SACE result which was part of their individual strategy. The ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking) is for students wanting to enter university and is a percentile result based on their rank across the state and country. A student who received an ATAR of 80 for instance, performed better than or equivalent to 80% of the students in that state and this is also factored in with performance across the country to an extent.

In 2024 at SCC, 100% of Year 12 student's achieved their SACE and 67% of student's achieved an ATAR between 50-99.5%.
